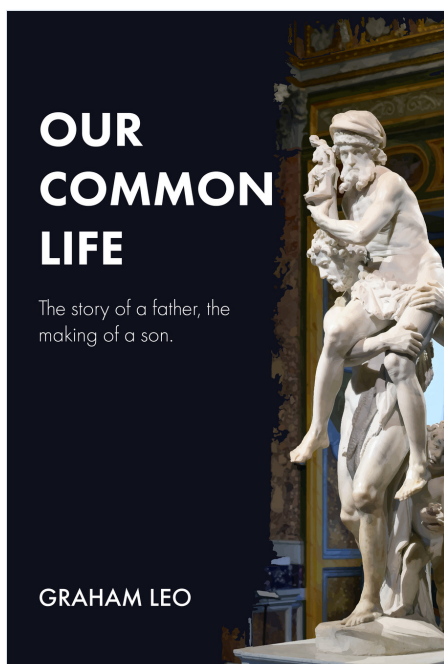


Our Common Life
